After I had welcomed our visitors and guests and on the spur of the moment, I said I would throw in a hundred dollars if a couple of others would match it and suggested tentatively, that we could add a *Shelter Box* to the already well organised Rotary response to the disaster.

'Lindsay' I asked, 'Are you organising *Shelter Box*?'

'I am now' he responded and reached for his serviette. He took out his pen and wrote on the serviette '*Shelter Box for Pakistan*' - added his name as a pledge and passed it on. When the 'Official Serviette' had completed its rapid 'hand to hand' journey around the room, we had collected just under two and a half thousand dollars. Not just one *Shelter Box* but two and a half.

I have been persuaded to leave the appeal open until the end of this week as I have been told a number of members who were not there would like to contribute. With the ascent of the Board, it is intended that; what began as an 'off the top of my head suggestion' - will result in the immediate purchase and dispatch of five...count them '5' *Shelter Boxes*. *Shelter Boxes* have proved themselves around the world as one of the most practical and effective first response disaster relief measures.

Thank you for your genuine compassion and generosity. When Lindsay handed me the 'Official Serviette' and I saw all those contributions I must confess to being quite surprised and deeply moved. That moment will remain for me as a major highlight of my Rotary year. It's events like this that remind us why we are Rotarians.

That moment makes the hours I spend reading Rotary emails all worthwhile....hang on a moment, now I'm getting carried away!

...and talking of being carried away, on Sunday 'Team Rotary' joined forces with Noah's Ark for 'Bridge to Brisbane' Fun Run. In the case of Ken, Phil and family, Gary, Jacque and myself it was a gentle walk; but James did the full 10km run. He moved so rapidly we didn't even see him!

Thank you to all of those members who went online to sponsor us and thank you to our team coach and motivator Susan and of course team manager Rosemary. We had a team debrief over brunch after the event and decided that next year we are going to make this a bit of an event and again throw our support behind Noah's Ark, so be warned.

Unfortunately I must conclude on a sad note. Shanna and Ian have had to cut their European Tour short to return to Australia. Ian's father died suddenly last week. I'm sure you know that our thoughts are with you both.

Born in 1822 in Sparkbrook, Francis Galton was the first scientist to propose a theory of general intelligence; that intelligence is a true, biologically-based mental faculty that can be studied by measuring a person's reaction times to cognitive tasks. Galton's research in measuring the head sizes of British scientists and laymen led to the conclusion that head-size is unrelated to a person's intelligence.
